


The visitor center of Alutaguse National Park is located in village Kauksi which is with a long tradition of beach holidays in Ida-Viru County.















Participation on häkaton

The hackathon is a form of co-creation, resulting in a shared view of community problems and innovative solutions to them. Community members are provided with a shared time and space to work on bottlenecks and solutions. The work is done in teams having gathered together within the framework of a common problem. The hackathon brings together the views of the citizen, official, entrepreneur, and expert.

The path of development of the hackathon has been supported through various projects over the years.

This time, the hackathon is supported by the 'Access Routes' project.

Development of accessible tourism routes

The aim of the project is to develop the accessibility of tourist sites in South Estonia and to develop cross-border accessible tourist routes, which will be presented on the shared online platform mapeirons.eu.

At the hackathon we will also be developing ideas and topics related to increasing access, doing so in cooperation with our partner organisations from Latvia.
